

For info: I have now spoken with at the Daily Telegraph about their data request, which was discussed at last month's DMAP meeting. They have clarified that their aim is compare the performance of schools at the level of individual subject factoring in variations in the type of student enrolled at each school. They are not looking to compare the performance of individual teachers and have offered "cast iron assurances that no children will be identified through our use

Following this discussion they are content to receive tier 2 level data comprising the KS2, KS4 and KS5 datasets matched to the school census. We are planning on supplying them 5 years of data which they will be able to use for up to 12 months. This contrasts with their original request for all datasets for all years at tier 1 level.

It appears the Daily Telegraph did not understand exactly what the datasets contained, which is why their original request was so broad. The data we are planning to supply will include prior attainment, aggregated ethnic group, aggregated language group, eligibility for Free School Meals and a SEN flag. These fields are to differentiate between the different intakes that schools have.

Based on the feedback received at the last DMAP meeting we are intending to proceed with issuing data outlined above. The request met the security requirements at both tier 1 and tier 2

5 years' worth of data (2008-2012) from the NPD were released including children's sensitive personal data, SEN and FSM indicators, ethnicity and language.

These identifying and sensitive items, or identifying data items were matched at individual pupil level with census data for KS2, KS4 and KS5 attainment datasets before individual level release.

There is no clear legal basis for passing journalists individual level, sensitive data:

"At the time of this request (February 2013) we did not require the requestor to inform us of the conditions for processing that they relied on." Department for Education (click to view original FOI)

## Risk: No small numbers suppression

"There is no suppression applied to data extracts from the NPD before release These include that no individual will be identified in published data. The Daily Telegraph requested pupil-level data and so suppression was not applicable." (click to view FOI)
