In preparation for the government review of Prevent in schools later this year, this discussion will be introduced by the Director of defenddigitalme, Jen Persson. Research so far has raised questions on staff workload, interferences with human and employment rights in use of personal devices and private email and websites. We find data protection law and rights infringements, and discrimination by race and religion. We want to take forward ideas for change, together with the NEU.
